## Karen Kinsinger



Karen Kinsinger became a member of AAUW in 1985, only a few years after the Morgan Hill Branch was first chartered. She knew several people in AAUW and was encouraged to join by her Holiday Lakes neighbor, Carolyn Wilson. She liked the focus of the organization and wanted to be associated with a group that supports women's rights.

Karen grew up in a small town of 3,000 people in Wetumka, Oklahoma. Proudly, she's part Cherokee Native American. [The name *Wetumka* is derived from the Indian words "we-wau" (water) and "tum-cau" (rumbling), describing a point where rapids raced over river rocks.] She graduated from Oklahoma College for Women in 1960. She majored in Home Economics, which included Early Childhood Education, as she wanted to be a teacher.

After completing her studies, Karen moved to Wichita, Kansas, where she taught public school kindergarten. It was there she met and married her

husband John in 1965. Subsequently, they moved to Dallas, Texas, where he finished his PhD in Clinical Psychology. She arrived the year before Texas started offering kindergarten classes in the public schools, so at first she taught a demonstration class for visiting Texas teachers.

She and John moved to Morgan Hill in 1971 and purchased the house in Holiday Lake Estates that they still own. John began working for Santa Clara County Mental Health, and Karen taught kindergarten at PA Walsh School for five years before she retired.

Karen made numerous contributions to AAUW over the years. She chaired an AAUW after-school tutoring project at the homeless shelter in San Martin in the late 80s. At Christmas time, she organized the group who collected and wrapped gifts at her home for the kids and parents at the shelter. In 1988, according to a MH Times article, 52 homeless families in South County had an abundance of gifts thanks to the efforts of AAUW. Karen recalls, "We were wrapping gifts and making bags for each family for two days."


