


Carolyn Wilson: 35 Year Branch Member

Carolyn and Chuck Wilson have moved permanently to their Santa Cruz beach house, selling their home in Holiday Lakes. She has been a branch member for 35 years, joining AAUW in 1984.

In December 1971 Carolyn and Chuck moved to Morgan Hill into a house that Chuck had built. They came from Livermore when Chuck's employer, General Electric, moved its offices to San Jose.



After spending a dozen years raising their three children, Carolyn joined AAUW Morgan Hill in 1984. She wanted to meet people, now

that she had only one child left at home. She already knew Nancy Foster (a charter branch member), as their sons were good friends through sports.

Carolyn was impressed with AAUW members' enthusiasm and liked meeting so many interesting and smart women. She recalls that Marilyn Gadway was president then and immediately added her to a committee.



In 1989 Carolyn was one of 29 members who each made a quilt square depicting various aspects of Morgan Hill history. She had never quilted before but had always wanted to learn. Her square depicted Transportation: El Camino Real bell and the MH railroad station. The completed quilt was presented to the historical museum, where it is still on display.

Over the years Carolyn served the branch in many ways: chair of hospitality and interest groups, calendar, and membership vice president in 1998-1999. In 2001 she was instrumental in encouraging the branch to participate in the 4th of July parade after a multi-year hiatus.

Carolyn ran in the Wildflower Run only once. That was the year a man with a gun threatened the women runners. After that, she stuck to volunteering. For several years she was in charge of the snack shack and food for runners. She says that it was all much simpler in those days. She later was a course marshal and more recently worked the 2K kids run.





She has also enjoyed various interest groups: afternoon book group, bridge, Poppy Jasper Singers (and learning to play steel pans), bicycling, hiking, and Smart eGals.
