Finance (Tessy Albin, Suman):

Cash Balance at 3/31/24 = \$15,159, lower than prior month by (\$ 611).

For the 9 months ended March 2024 cash balance is lower by (\$ 4, 160)

Major expenses in March were the cost for New Member Wine and Whine at The Grange \$550.

 - Suman has been busy meeting with Heritage and had several documents that needed to be signed by the Secretary and President-Elect

- Current membership holds at 188

 - Food cost is going to be about \$125 more than last year

Programs (Margaret McCann):

- April 20 program is Earth Day
 - Margaret passed out flyers that advertise the event
 - The event will include:
 - Have 23 vendor participants
 - 3 Food Trucks
 - A plant sale starting at 9am
 - A Bike clinic offered by Bike TherapyHealth Care Coverage for Rape and Sexual Assault Survivors
 - Musical entertainment
 - Raffle prizes
 - o Great partnership with the city

Bylaws/Governance (Carol O'Hare):

- Branch members' voting on the Bylaws Amendments Term Limits proposal and the proposed slate of officers has reached a quorum
- Branch members are encouraged to participate in the National Open Membership Vote which started on April 3 and ends on May 15

Public Policy (Susan Rife)

- Lobby Days on 4/2-4/3 was the first in-person meetup since the pandemic
 - o Susan, Suman, Krisse and Harpreet met with our state assembly member Gail Pellerin
 - The importance of constituents reaching out to their state representatives on issues was stressed as those numbers can be used to advance bills
 - The bills for which AAUW had talking points were:
 - Assembly Bill 2099 Protecting Reproductive Health Clinics
 - Assembly Bill 2326 Public Postsecondary Education: Sex Discrimination Policies
 - Assembly Bill 2843 Health Care Coverage for Rape and Sexual Assault Survivors
- To address attacks on our public school system by the 'Concerned Parents' organization, we are collaborating with MHUSD to get a panel of teachers, students and librarians to discuss the issues
 - Two dates are set for these panel discussions: 4/29 and 5/13
 - Topics to be covered are: sex education, gender dysphoria, social and emotional learning, ethnic studies and DEI

Wildflower Run (Joy Safakish, Bobbie Erb):

- Sold out again! 5k and 10k volunteers were great this year
- Donations: \$15,892 from members (\$16,902 total from members and non-members)
- Survey results were generally good some complaints from young moms about the cold
- Over \$90K was grossed but expenses were up again this year
- Not all chair positions were filled again this year; Heather is retiring from parking position; Liz is retiring from the Road Show job so she can run; post race standings and middle awards were confusing

- Our 2nd Annual Red Dress Day will be on 5/4/24 at the Library
 - This year we will have a bigger room
 - We need 4-5 more mannequins

- Presenter topics included: Communication skills, Racial Injustice, Small business entrepreneurship, Interviewing skills, Personal finance, Math and Robotics(STEM), Leadership skills, Environmentalism(climate change information), Teen Health, UJAM activity
- Keynote address topic was Climate Change by Diya Khandhra
- Attendees were given a survey to respond to at the end of the Conference. We will compile information to help us organize the Conference for 2025
- Quote regarding the Conference from on of our YWL Leaders:
 - "Being a part of the planning and actual conference has just made me such a better person by being able to pivot when things don't work, pushing hard for something you care about, and making little changes in the world(even if the whole world doesn't see)....By creating a space

that everyone feels safe in it shows people that it's ok to be yourself and that meeting new individuals isn't as scary as it seems. It also shows that the risk of putting yourself out there is worth it."

- We have received \$600 grant money from Silicon Valley Clean Energy and we will receive \$1,000 from the County of Santa Clara Commission on the Status of Women after April 8th.
- The next YWL Meeting will take place April 8, 2024 and we plan to get feedback from our members relating to the Conference
- May 13th will be the last YWL meeting for this year. We plan to have a guest speaker from the Peace Corps.
